It traps us, provoking a preliminary, properly aesthetic pleasure, turning our internal "censor" off guard. And then, it enables us to enjoy our own deep prohibited fantasies - projected on the art - without shame and selfblame, with revealing catharsis. How are artists able to do this? It's their mystic secret; it's art.
